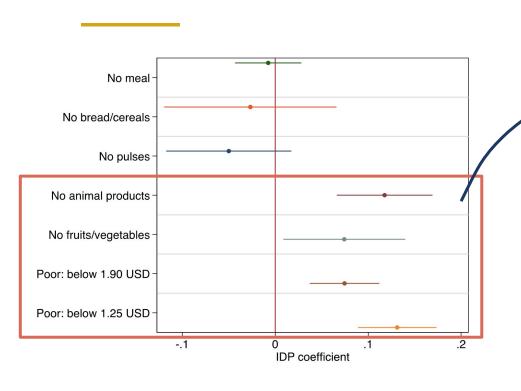




### We conduct research to improve lives and livelihoods shaped by violent conflict, fragility, and humanitarian emergencies



### In fragile settings, women face multiple, compounding crises



IDP households are significantly more likely to have inadequate nutrition and live in poverty

...but being a woman AND displaced creates even worse outcomes:

- More likely to be poor
- Lower subjective well-being
- More likely to pull children from school

# IDP women are more likely to be doing unpaid labor and working in agriculture

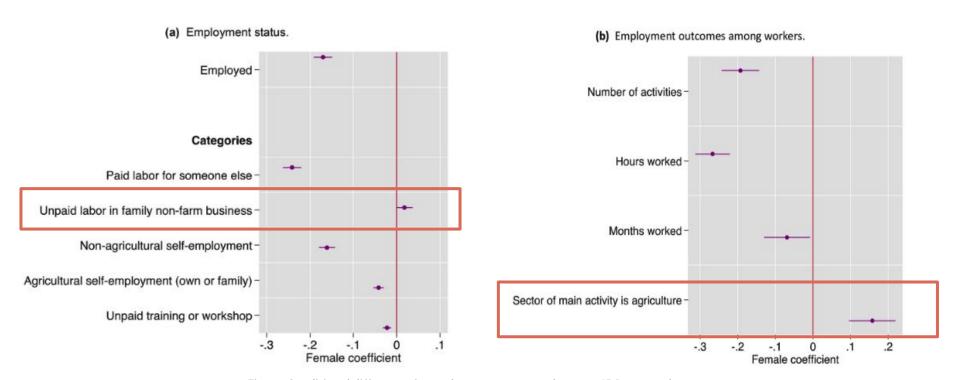
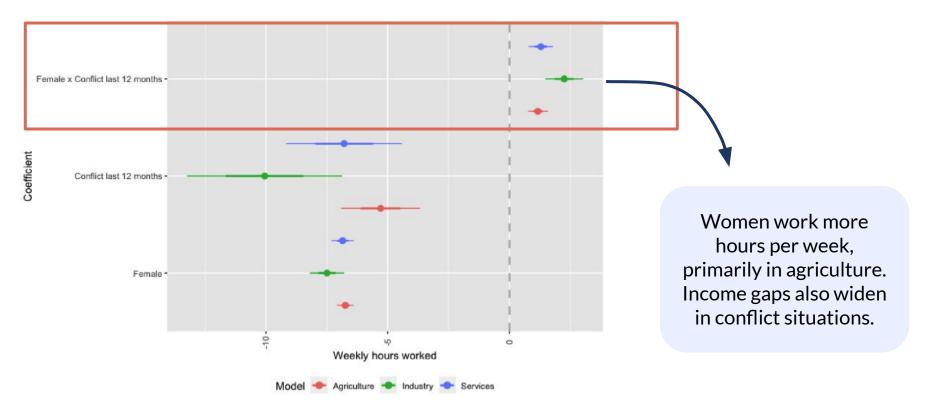


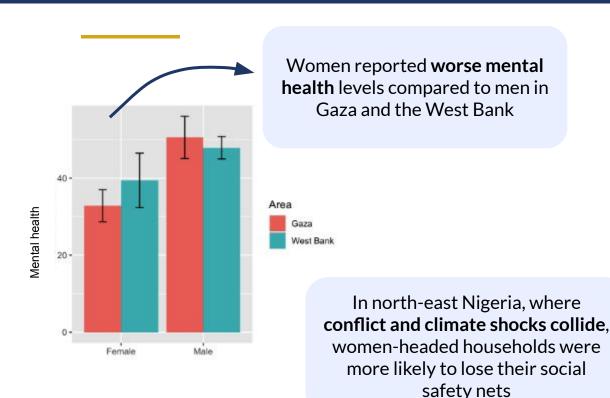
Figure. Conditional differences in employment outcomes between IDP men and women

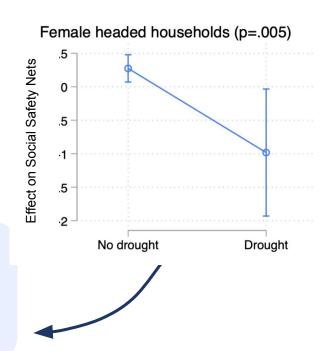
## Women work longer in agriculture and with relatively low monetary returns during conflict all across Africa



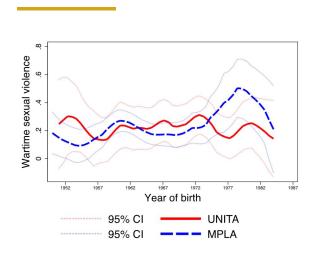

### Women and women-headed households tend to face worse outcomes

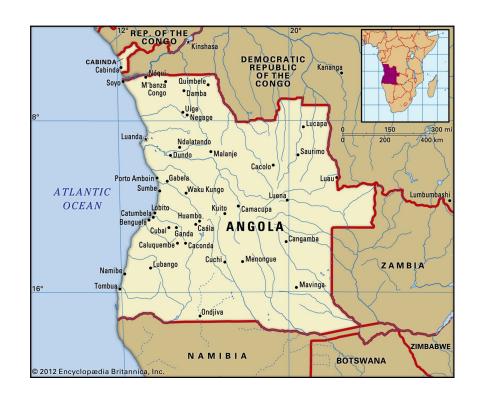




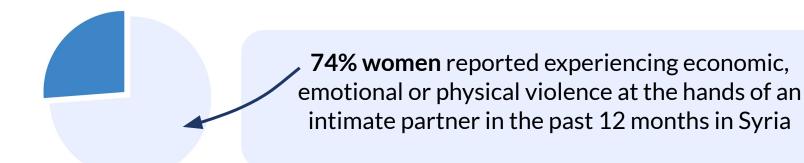
### Wartime violence against women increases IPV



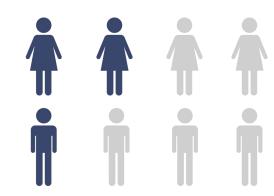
In Angola, young men who were exposed to wartime sexual violence against women were more likely to commit IPV more than a decade after exposure



## In Syria, three-quarters of women report experiencing some form of IPV



Women were more than **twice as likely** to report experiencing economic IPV compared to men reporting its perpetration



### In Peru, violence has institutional effects: fewer women elected

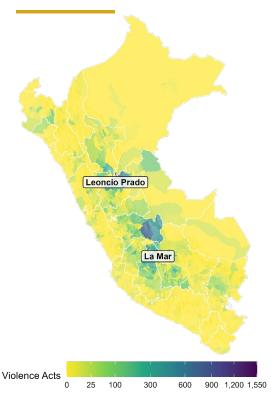

# Fragile settings disadvantage women through multiple, intersecting pathways

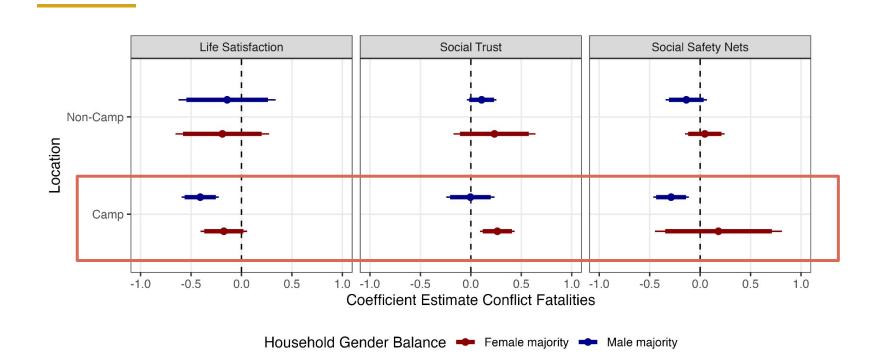
- Intersectionality matters: gender + displacement, conflict, or crises creates multiplicative disadvantages that go far beyond the sum of individual factors
- Effects cascade across time and space: wartime violence creates cycles that persist for decades



#### Women adapt within constraints

Despite facing multiple constraints, women actively increase their work participation and develop coping strategies during crisis

### Women cultivating community in Sierra Leone



"Cows have eaten my plantations once, I was very upset.

I didn't say a word and just summoned [the herder] to the chiefs. We were able to settle it.

I really wanted to eat those crops as the fruit of my labor.

However, peace is what we all want, I didn't want to break that..."

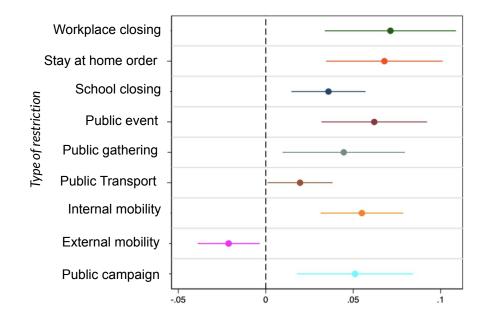

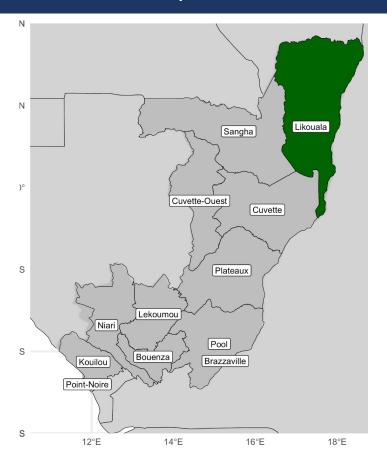
### Women's adapt under pandemic pressures across Africa

Figure. Covid-19 stringency index sub-indices and tension at home

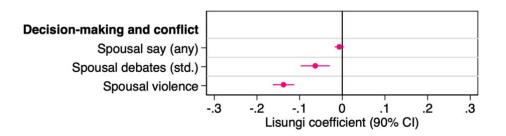


# Cash transfers improve joint decision making and decrease spousal violence

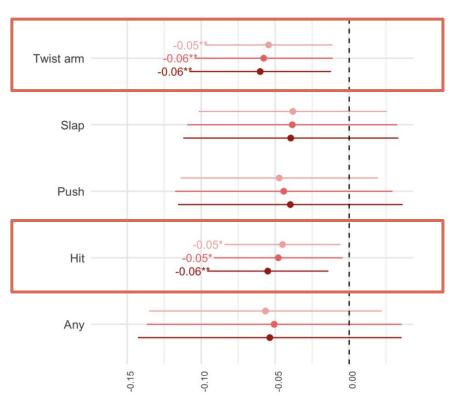


Cash transfers to households improve joint decision-making and decrease spousal violence in the Republic of Congo

# Engaging women and men together can help reduce IPV in Syria

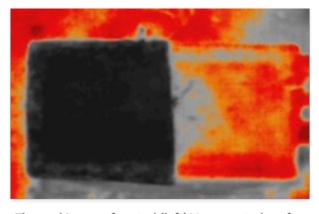

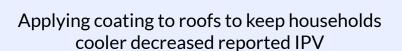

# Women as agents for change: were more responsive to peacebuilding intervention in Sierra Leone

Following a PBF-supported project bundling cash, land rehabilitation, and social cohesion elements:

Female farmers were significantly less likely to report involvement in disputes with outgroup, whereas men showed no comparable reduction.

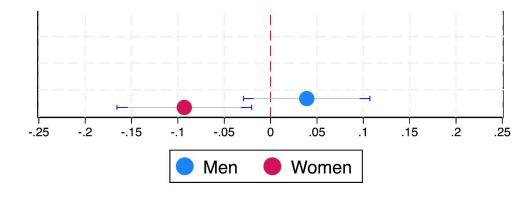


Figure. Effects of peacebuilding intervention on reported farmer-herder conflict

### Women are active as civic actors, leaders, and moral anchors in Guatemala



A PBF-supported project promoted women's leadership through female mediators and inclusive dialogue spaces. Women were exceptionally engaged: they attended local meetings, joined dialogue spaces and elections, and were active in social groups.
